Update from the Midwest Hemp Council:

Last night, Senator Paul offered his amendment to strike language intended to destroy the hemp market from the Senate's agriculture appropriations bill — language that criminalizes tens of millions of adult consumers, farmers and small businesses. Thank you, Senator Paul, for your leadership and courage! You can listen to his reasoning for offering the amendment by <u>clicking here</u>.

Unfortunately, Senator Mitch McConnell led a procedural motion to table the amendment, effectively blocking Senator Paul's amendment from receiving a vote. By including authorizing language in this appropriations bill, the Senate is breaking their own rules in order to hide this massive shift in policy in a totally unrelated bill. Every American should question public policy when it is concocted behind closed doors, on a weekend and in violation of the Senate's own rules.

The industry's focus now moves over to the House of Representatives, which could hold a vote on this bill as soon as Wednesday. Back in September, Congressman Comer led the charge on penning a bipartisan letter with 26 other members of Congress letting leadership know they will not vote for any bill that criminalizes popular hemp products. What can you do? Make sure your Representative knows you oppose criminalizing hemp and hemp products. You can also customize the message to include how hemp and hemp products have improved your quality of life. This must be done today and tomorrow before the vote on Wednesday.
